Block of the Month

Congratulations to Bonnie Eamigh for winning the pastel blocks at the June meeting.

Carol Marks and Marlene Marlowe have an exciting BOM in store for us this year. The colors are going to be pink, chocolate, and tan. Each block will be a different star.

In with this newsletter you will find a pattern for the September block and a piece of the background fabric to create your first block.

At the September meeting the committee will be selling one yard of background fabric for \$5.00 (the guild is picking up the additional cost of the fabric). Each month you will receive a star pattern either via US mail or on our web site. Every month the colors stay the same: pink, chocolate, and your tan background fabric.

Now here is where it gets tricky: for every block you hand in you will receive a ticket. You put your name on the ticket or tickets and put them in a sealed can. One block one ticket, 3 blocks three tickets. At each meeting Marlene and Carol will be taking home 12 of the blocks collected that night. Any blocks over the 12 you will have a chance to win and take home with you that night.

Now I know you are wondering what Marlene and Carol are doing with all those blocks they are collecting each month. They will be organizing the blocks to best create quilt tops. Then at the June meeting everyone that has tickets in the sealed can will be in the drawing to win a complete kit for a quilt top. How many blocks they collect during the year determines how many quilt kits they have to offer. It could potentially be as many as 12 kits. When I say complete that means twelve blocks and the border fabric.

If you plan on participating bring your money so you can purchase your background fabric. If you can't make the meeting, just let Marlene or Carol know and they will see to it that you get your fabric before the October meeting.

Charity Quilts

Once again the generosity our guild members have shown to our chosen charities is overwhelming. There were twelve quilts handed in at the June meeting which puts us at well over 20 quilts donated to the Quilts of Valor for the 2007/08 guild year..

The 2008/09 Charity Quilt Committee has chosen the Children's Home of Easton as the recipient of our charity quilts this year. The committee is setting their sights high, desiring to donate a quilt to every child who lives at the home for Christmas. There are 16 girls and 39 boys presently living at the home. The children range from ages 9 to 18.

The committee spent an enjoyable morning in July putting 35 quilt kits together. They had so much fun sorting through the fabrics and hope that they assembled kits that you will enjoy creating. Each quilt contains approximately 8.5 yards of fabric for the front and back. You are welcome to use the suggested pattern or choose your own pattern. A variety of quilt designs will make the quilts unique for those receiving them for Christmas. Sharon has informed us that the boys love sports. Many play basketball and football. As always, girls are girls and they just love being girls.

The Guild is well on its way towards their goal. Many of you have already started; the committee knows of 32 quilts that are underway. They are so thankful for the enthusiastic response to this project!
