Harvest of Quilts – 2009 Quilt Show

October 24 & 25

Many of the details are coming together for our Quilt Show in October. The Committee has been diligently working to organize this event. Irene Compton has spent numerous hours promoting this event. We are hoping for a large turn out thanks to her efforts. One hundred and twenty eight quilts have been entered by twenty-six of our members. Just imagine how colorful the exhibit area will be with all those beautiful quilts!

The Quilt Show Committee is hoping for 100% participation from our Guild members. Check out the list on the next page to see how you can help. Your admission is free to the show when you volunteer to work.

Our October meeting is devoted to the final planning for the Show. Here is some information for you to review before our meeting:

- Members are to arrive fir set-up at 3:00 pm on Friday. Please bring family, friends and tools. Pizza and soda will be served to the workers on Friday night.
- All quilts and display items need to be at the school by 5:00pm on Friday. Don't forget to label your display items with your name and address.
- You need to begin and end each shift at the Admissions table. Pick up your nametag there and return it when you leave. The white gloves will be stored there as well.

- Children 12 and under will enter free with a paid admission.
- In addition to the displays, the Committee plans to set up a Tea Party area and a Kitchen area. Kindly bring any items that might work in these areas on Friday evening as well. Remember to label every item that you bring!
- Our guild members and vendors have stepped forward to provide eight demonstrations during the Show. Mary Ellen has done a great job coordinating the demonstrations. Thank you!
- Extension cords are needed. Please bring them on Friday evening. Make sure that your name is on the cord to ensure that it is returned to you.
- Members who do not work are asked to pay the admission fee.

Quilt Show – How Can You Help?

- Take a sign to be placed on the Friday night before the Show. Judy, Carol and Trina have a map of the desired sign locations. It is most important that you also PICK up the sign on Sunday on your way home from the show. Signs are to be returned to Judy at the October meeting.
- Sign up to help at the Quilt Show. There are opportunities to work in the Consignment Boutique, Café, Raffle tables and Admissions table. Volunteers are also needed to relieve vendors for breaks throughout the show. White Glove ladies are needed to assist our guests to view the quilts. Even if you are not signed up as a White Glove lady, you can don a pair and help out in your free time at the Show. Sign Up forms will be circulating at the October meeting.
- Bring a fat quarter donation to Janet Keymetian at the October Meeting.
- Check your sewing area for donations for the large baskets to be raffled at the Show. A great opportunity to clean up your quilt stash. Perhaps you might find some fabric, pattern books, sewing gadgets, rotary cutters, etc., that would work in baskets of quilting supplies. Bring your donations to Marlene Marlowe at the next Guild meeting or contact her directly.
- Start preparing your items for the Consignment Boutique. Your items must be marked with both your name and the price. The tag should be easily removed to ensure that you receive your payment. Prepare a complete list of the items you are placing in the Boutique. Keep a copy for yourself. All items should be brought to the school on Friday night.
- Look through your recipe box and plan what baked good you will make. All members are being asked to donate a baked good. These need to be <u>nut free</u> items such as cookies, cupcakes, bars or brownies (uncut). The kitchen staff will wrap the items for easy handling and sale.
- Plan to help with the Show set up on Friday night (October 24). We have a 5 to 6 hour window to assemble the quilt racks and hang the muslins and quilts. Husbands, boyfriends, teenagers, and girlfriends are welcome. If you have a ladder and tools bring them along. We will be taking down the racks and quilts after the show on Sunday.
