Sometimes it is difficult to see through a very thick fabric such as felted wool or a quilt that has already been sandwiched with the batting and backing. This makes tracing a quilting pattern onto the quilt very difficult. Using Press'n Seal (which is available in the grocery) simplifies this process.

First trace the quilting pattern onto the Press'n Seal with a fine tip permenant marker such as Pigma Pen size .05 and let the ink dry.

Then place this traced pattern onto the quilt in the desired location and finger press in place. Lower the feed dogs on your machine and use a darning foot to free motion quilt along all the lines of the quilting pattern.

After all the stitching has been finished; tear away the Press'n Seal leaving only the stitched quilting. In this photo I have started to remove some of the Press'n Seal. I use my fingernail to scratch at the Press'n Seal or sometimes I use tweezers to help pull off the pieces of the Press'n Seal. - from Quilts by Rosemary; donated by Nancy Murphy, ESQG

### Quilts of Valor<sup>®</sup> 2017 Block Drive

The 2017 Quilts of Valor block drive features not one, but two blocks that play well together. You may make one or both. Once completed, bring your blocks to the May Quilt Guild meeting or if you can't make the meeting, mail to: Block Drive Coordinator, Karen Demaree, PO Box 628, Platteville, WI 53818 They will be distributed nationwide to be made into Quilts of Valor.


The purpose of the national block drive is to give individuals or groups who wish to make just a few blocks but not assemble a quilt to have their block(s) in quilts across the nation. These blocks can be assembled many ways into a QOV. Blocks received by June 1, 2017 will be distributed at National Conference. After that, they will be distributed to new Group Leaders to help them get started. Guidelines:

- 1. Use any combination of traditional QOV colors. The Snowball block provides a great place for those larger patriotic prints. Use the best quality fabric you can afford. 2. Use a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" seam allowance and press carefully. 3. Block should measure  $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " as sewn and will be 12" in the quilt.
- 2. Bring blocks to May guild meeting so they can all be mailed out together. (Or mail to Block Drive Coordinator listed above.)

## Snowball Block

 $1 - 12\frac{1}{2}$ " square print



On the wrong side of the 4" squares draw a diagonal line. Place right sides together on the corner of the large square, carefully aligning the edges. Sew a thread width away from the drawn line towards the corner.

Repeat for all corners. Press toward the corner. It should line up. If not, check your stitch for straightness and placement. Cut away the print and one triangle leaving a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch seam allowance. Must measure  $12 \frac{1}{2}$ ".

## **Floating Star**


 $1 - \frac{41}{2}$ " square center of star

- $8 4\frac{1}{2}$ " squares background
- $8 2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares star points

On the wrong side of the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " star point squares draw a diagonal line. Place right sides together on the corner of a background square, carefully aligning the edges. Sew a thread width away from the drawn line towards the corner.


Repeat on the opposite corner of the block as shown in the diagram. Repeat for a total of 4 squares. Cut away the background and one triangle leaving a <sup>1</sup>/4" seam allowance.

> This is what the finished quilt will look like.









# Sun-Bonnet Sue /Overall Sam Challenge

#### Calling All Quilters, Embroiderers and Needle Artists:

To celebrate the 80th Anniversary of the Warren County Farmer's Fair, the Evening Star Quilter's Guild and the Tapestry Fiber Arts Group of Warren County, New Jersey, are co-sponsoring a Free Style Sun-Bonnet Sue Open Block Challenge. This challenge will consist of a 10.5 inch square block featuring Sun-Bonnet Sue (or Overall Sam for any Man Quilter so inclined).

The block can be designed in the traditional appliqué format, or in red-work, embroidered, be-dazzled, beaded, wool felted, chenille, or in any combination of techniques. Be creative!

Each block must be a 10.5 inch square on a neutral background with Sun-Bonnet Sue as the main feature. Please sign your block. An historical record of all participants will be included.

Prizes will be awarded to the top three block entries.

Our goal is to have as many blocks as possible in order to piece a quilt during the Fair. The quilt will then be archived locally.

Dear Evening Star Members,

The charity that was chosen by the Guild this year is "Haven of Hope for Kids," located in the town of Hope, NJ. Since its inception in 2005, "Haven of Hope" has been hosting cost-free vacations for families with children who have life threatening illnesses. To date, they have hosted more than 250 families in their cottage that is located in the heart of historic Hope.

The cottage is fully furnished and can accommodate 8 people for a 6 day stay. Families arrive on Wednesday and are greeted by the summer co-coordinator who will accompany them throughout their week's stay. During this time they will visit two area working farms, enjoy a day at Land of Make-Believe and swimming at the Belvidere Pool. Fishing is also available.

Upon their arrival on Wednesday, they are provided funds to purchase a week's worth of food at the Acme. Pizza is provided the family their first evening in the cottage. A home-cooked meal is provided by a volunteer on Friday evening, and a BBQ is held on Saturday by a local sponsor.

A shuttle service is provided Monday for those that do not have a car.

"Haven of Hope" is funded by individual donations and grants. There is no government subsidy. There are no costs incurred by the family.

With this very important purpose in mind, we are determined to make this the most successful charitable fundraise ever. Our goal this year is to seek handmade items from members in the following areas:
